

We launched our new Art Ambassadors club in November 2024 with the aim to bring together students across all year groups, to give them the opportunity to work on collaborative whole school and community based Art projects. Students completed an application form to explain why they would be the ideal candidate for the role, and we were inundated with applications! After final selection, we appointed a total of 34 Art Ambassadors in Years 7-13! Each Ambassador was given a badge to celebrate their role.

The group meets every Wednesday after school and have planned out various ideas for projects they would like to work on, as well as being given set briefs. It has given students in different year groups a chance to make friends, but also learn from one another and share ideas.













- Mental Health Art Club which is led by two of our Year 9 students and takes place every Thursday
















SANDLING PRIMARY SCHOOL MURAL

Students have researched each word to find the meaning, and then developed an illustration which they felt best represents each word. They worked in teams of 2-3 to create their designs, and will be working in small groups with the students from Sandling Primary School to paint the panels next academic year!
