### Wellbeing and Enrichment Days

During the lockdown of Early 2021 we introduced an Wellbeing and Enrichment day for every student and every member of staff.

The idea of these days was to take a break from the endless zoom lessons and ever increasing screen time and to do something to look after ourselves,

for example a personal development activity or perhaps a character building activity.



Students got to choose from a 'menu' of different activities that could complete each week and were encouraged to send pictures in of what they had been up too. For some it was a simple as going for a walk with their families,

cooking or meal or drawing a picture. For some students it was learning a new hobby and one student even learnt a new language!

#### **Character Walk**
