Advice to All Parents - Single case in Year 11

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to inform you that this evening I have had the news that a student in Year 11 has tested positive for Coronavirus/ Covid-19 this is in addition to our Year 9 student and Year 10 student who I have also written to you about.

As you know the health and safety of our students and staff is always our first priority and as such I have taken the very difficult decision to close the school to Year 11 as well as Year 9 and 10. I really believe this is necessary action to at least slow down the risk of infection. The school will be deep cleaned during this time. Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 must self-isolate for 14 days. **Students must stay at home and not leave the house for any reason.**

Year 9 will return on Monday 7th December.

Year 10 will return on Monday 14th December.

Year 11 will return on Monday 14th December.

Year 11 students will be expected to follow the full school timetable from home - another letter providing clear guidance about this is attached. Years 9 and 10 have already received this letter and must also follow the full school timetable from home.


The school remains open to all other students in Years 7, 8, 12 and 13 should continue to attend as normal if they remain well and are showing no Covid related symptoms. If you have a child in year 11 and siblings in another year group at Aylesford School, the siblings should still attend school.

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We know that you may find this concerning but we are continuing to monitor the situation and are working closely with Public Health England. This letter is to inform you of the current situation and provide advice on how to support your child. Please be reassured that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

Please be assured that we are following all government guidance and advice from Public Health England to minimise the risk of our students. The DFE have asked us to remind you of the following advice:

HANDS:

• Staff and students must wash hands or hand sanitise regularly throughout the day (On arrival, entering a new building, at the end of break and at the end of lunch).

FACE:

• All students and staff are required to wear masks/ face coverings in enclosed spaces, including in classrooms during lessons.

SPACE:

- Students must not touch each other
- Students must maintain at least 1 metre distance where possible and 2 metres in communal areas.
- Students must maintain a 2 metre distance from staff at all times

Please remind your child that they must not mix with students outside of school - this includes on the way to school and on the way home from school. Students from different bubbles must not car share.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test</u> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

Symptoms

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

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There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
