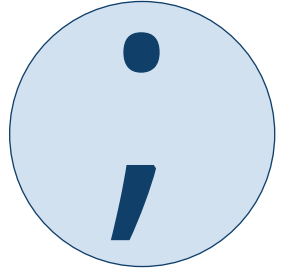


SPaG Starters **Semi-Colons**



A good way to check whether you have used a semi-colon correctly is to see if you can replace it with a full stop. If the clauses either side of the full stop still make sense independently, then you have used the semi-colon correctly.

e.g.

The bus was so overcrowded; I felt really claustrophobic.

Each sentence either side is an independent clause; the semi-colon could be replaced by a full stop.

Can you insert semi-colons into these sentences?
